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**SEMINAR TO ADDRESS HOW STATE IS PREVENTING WISCONSIN EMPLOYERS
FROM COMMUNICATING WITH THEIR EMPLOYEES**

Green Bay, Wis.- (July 7, 2010) - Legislation signed into law by Governor Doyle on May 12, 2010 restricts Wisconsin employers from responding to union organizing efforts. The law makes it discriminatory to take any adverse employment action against an employee who refuses to attend a meeting the employer conducts to educate employees about the real significance of union membership. The bottom line: Wisconsin employers will be hindered by the state from communicating with their employees.
