LEADERSHIP GREEN BAY CLASS OF 2011-2012 NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

Green Bay WI (Feb. 4, 2011) – Leadership Green Bay, a community leadership program by the Green Bay Area Chamber of Commerce, is accepting the first 50 applications received for the 2011-2012 Leadership Green Bay class.

The program educates participants about the community and helps mold them into contributing leaders in the community. Leadership Green Bay strives to select a cross-section of participants from all sectors of the community. The most important factor in the application selection is identifying individuals who are most apt to use their leadership skills for the long-term benefit of the community.

Participants will meet one day per month, October through May, following a two-day overnight retreat in September. Sessions focus on Green Bay's local economy, education, local history and heritage, diversity and cultural awareness, human services, government and environment. In addition, small groups work on projects designed to enhance awareness of community problems, identify systems and methods to affect change, and develop project management, team and presentation skills. The groups meet on their own time outside Leadership Green Bay sessions.
